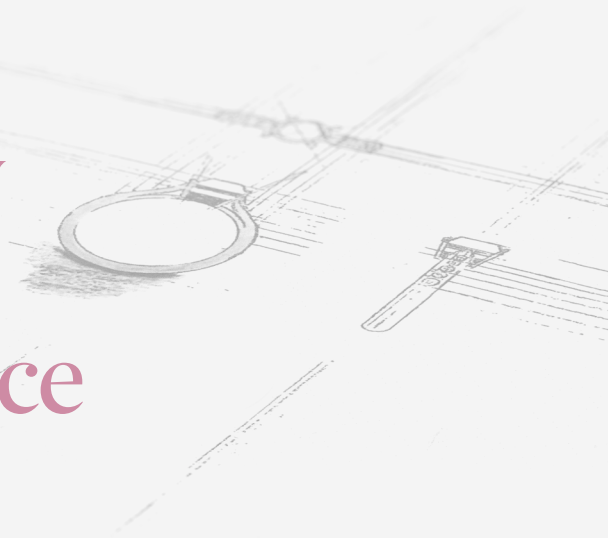

The process



Stage 1

Experience a personal consultation with one of our wedding jewellery designers. In your first consultation, your designer will delve into your design ideas, desired specifications, and budget, curating a piece that matches your vision.

Stage 2

Your concepts come to life as one of our talented wedding jewellery designers sketches your design, which will be showcased to you during your second meeting. If required, adjustments will be made until you're completely satisfied and confirm the design.

Stage 3

Once the design is finalised, we provide a detailed quote along with an optional CAD digital model, offering a 2D/3D glimpse of your future masterpiece.

Stage 4

A 50% deposit should be settled prior to the commencement of the creation of your bespoke jewellery piece.

Stage 5

When your unique jewellery piece is ready, we invite you back to The Perth Mint for the grand unveiling.

- This personalised experience is available in person only.
- To protect our designs and your interests, original sketches or CAD images aren't given out before a confirmation or deposit is made.
- If you're unable to visit The Perth Mint in person, we facilitate steps 3-5 via telephone and email, with sketches and CADs being sent with watermarks for security.

Understanding the 4Cs of diamonds

Cut, colour, clarity, and carat weight are the most crucial factors that determine a diamond's value. It's essential to understand these 4Cs before choosing a diamond for your engagement ring.

Cut

This refers to how well the diamond is cut and proportioned. A well-cut diamond reflects more light and has better dispersion – or fire, as it's known in the industry.

Colour

Diamond colour is graded on a scale from D (colourless) to Z (light yellow to brown). The closer the diamond is to colourless, the more pure it is.

Clarity

This refers to the number of inclusions or blemishes in a diamond. The fewer inclusions or blemishes, the more valuable the diamond will be.

Carat weight

This refers to the weight of the diamond. The heavier the diamond, the larger it is and will generally be more expensive.

Unveiling the inspiration

Uncover the creativity and meticulous attention to detail involved in making our custom-made engagement rings and timeless wedding bands. In this article, we chat to Michael Falocco, FGAA, one of The Perth Mint's talented wedding jewellery designers.

How did you become a wedding jewellery designer?

When I was studying Gemmology at the Gemmological Association of Australia (GAA) I took an interest in the introduction to antique jewellery and started to dabble in my own designs. That was five years ago now and to this day I still catch myself sketching in my free time when I need to switch off. I enjoy the wedding market as more people are looking for that bespoke item which gives me the opportunity to design.

What qualities do you look for in the perfect piece of wedding jewellery?

Personally, I look for quality. Every designer has their own style, some original and some more commercial; however, it speaks volumes if the finished piece is of high quality and standards. Wedding jewellery, like love is meant to last a lifetime and as a designer, the last thing I'd want is to produce a piece of jewellery that feels and looks rushed.

What process do you follow to create wedding jewellery?

Normally I start with a very rough drawing and see if anything comes from it. Then I move to the more traditional way of sketching.

What advice can you give to couples when it comes to choosing their wedding jewellery?

Do not rush, be open minded and ask as many questions as you need. Many couples already have an idea of their dream wedding jewellery and sometimes that perfect image doesn't relay when trying it on. Don't be disappointed and take this opportunity as the beginning of your new journey with your loved one.

What is your favourite material to work with, and why?

Gold, specifically Australian Origin Gold. Diamonds and gemstones are beautiful in their own way however, I love when gold anchors the vision and brings the design to life.

What influences your creative design process?

I always take inspiration from nature and challenge myself to transfer that vision onto a cold object like metal. Sometimes I don't feel inspired at all and forcing it usually results in a design that I won't produce, let alone show anyone. When creatively blocked, I pivot to a 3-step process: research, exploration, and stop. If I keep thinking about the design when in the 'stop' process, it's usually a sign that the inspiration is making a comeback.

How do you keep up with the latest trends in wedding jewellery design?

I love jewellery so it isn't too difficult keeping up with what's in vogue. Wedding expos really give you a great insight into what's in and what's out.

What technology do you use to enhance your jewellery designs?

Personally, I'm old school and stick with the traditional pencil, paper, and ruler. If a design is very intricate, I collaborate and provide my sketches with CAD drafter.

Can you adapt a design to suit a client's budget?

Absolutely! One of my favourite parts of designing for a client is fitting all their requirements within their budget while flavouring the collaboration with my design style.

What steps do you take to ensure the ethical sourcing of materials?

When sourcing materials, I generally deal with members of the Responsible Jewellery Council (RJC) so I can ensure that responsible standards are upheld at The Perth Mint.
